Michelle Dion is Associate Professor in Political Science and Acting Director of the Centre for Research in Empirical Social Sciences (CRESS) at McMaster University. Her work spans political economy, comparative public opinion, and gendered practices in political science. She teaches courses in comparative public policy, research methodology and applied statistics for the social sciences. Her book, *Workers and Welfare* (U of Pittsburgh Press), explains a century of social protection policies in Mexico, and her research has appeared in *Political Analysis*, *Comparative Politics*, *International Studies Quarterly*, *Latin American Research Review*, *Latin American Politics & Society*, *Journal of Latin American Studies*, *Social Politics*, and *PS: Political Science and Politics*,

among others. She has been active in the Visions in Methodology network, which aims to promote gender diversity in the field of political methodology, and the McMaster University Faculty Association.
