Recipient, Academic Librarians' and Archivists' Distinguished Service Award



Marc Richard is an Associate Librarian at McGill University, where he has worked since 1985; he is a rare materials cataloguer in the Cataloguing and Metadata Unit of Collection Services. He has been involved in faculty association work in various capacities during his career, including service as Chair of the MAUT Librarians' Section (1996-1997 and 2011-2012); as Vice-President External of MAUT (1992-1994); and as Secretary of FQPPU (1993-1995), during which time he participated in establishing the *Protocole de coopération entre l'ACPPU et la FQPPU*. He has a long-standing interest in university governance; he has been an elected librarian member of the McGill Senate since 2006, and he currently serves both on the Senate Steering Committee and on the Committee on the Rights of Senate. He was a member (2011) of the ad hoc committee which drafted the terms of reference of Library Council, a new governance body similar to McGill's faculty councils, and he was a member (2005-2007) of the ad hoc committee which undertook an extensive revision of the

Regulations Relating to the Employment of Librarian Staff.
